Highlights:



Role of the ACFP

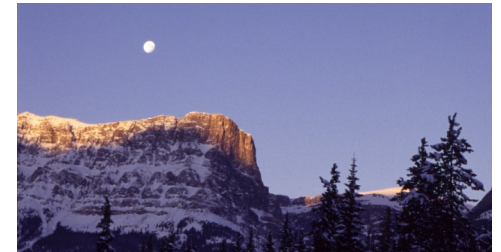
Speakers travel, expenses and honorarium are sponsored by the ACFP.
